BALKAN PROVERB:

“Watch out! The Serbs may out-sing you, the Bulgarians may out-dance you, but the Macedonians will always out-sing, out-dance, and out-play you!”

Situated right at Europe’s doorway to the Middle East, Macedonia is the ancient cultural crossroads bridging East and West, Slav and Mediterranean. The very word itself has come to mean “mix” or “variety” as in the famous French “salade macedoine”. And nothing gives a better taste of this mingling than its lively folkloric tradition.

Macedonia is home to Europe’s best-integrated Romany population, whose music flows freely throughout the country, especially during its now-famous summer wedding and festival season.



“Etno-Malesh” takes it into the streets, where celebrations join the earthy beats of the “Tapan” drums and the call of the “Zurli”. During the wedding season, the mobile musical spectacle is the festive companion to bridal processions throughout the towns & villages.

LOCAL MASTER, INTERNATIONAL RISING STAR.

Milaim (Milo) Destanovski was brought up in the family musical tradition - learning from his own father and passing the heritage down to his own sons.

He was curator, musician & choreographer Berovo's Folkloric Society for close to 20 years before moving to the US.

Milo now travels extensively bringing his knowledge of Balkan and Romany music & dance to festivals & workshops around the world.

A family ensemble including Milo and his sons on zurli and his brother Džafer on tapan, the band accompanies so many community activities in Berovo.

During Ancestral Steps 2026, the band will accompany some of our folkloric dance workshops with Milo, and we'll also get a chance to dance with them publicly during the parade.

Some of the dances we'll be learning with Milo include "Maleševka",

"Berovka", "Kopačka", "Nevestinsko" and more.

You can always request a dance step from Milo and Džafer as both are really steeped in the ancestral steps.

Uska Kan is widely regarded as one of the top Balkan brass bands to rise to prominence in the last 10 years. The orchestra's great success is largely due to its long-standing history of family musical tradition, particularly the multi-generational tradition of the Kanturovski family. Uska Kan has won many awards over the years, but they first garnered international recognition and acclaim following two wins at "Guča", the world's most famous Brass Band festival and competition, based in Guča, Serbia.

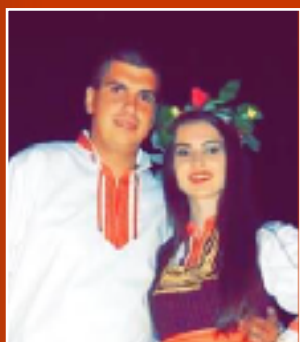
In 2012, the band's youngest trumpet soloist and rising star, Demir Kanturovski, won the Guča Festival's prestigious "Golden Trumpet" (Zlatna Truba) prize. Although rooted in tradition, Uska Kan's music is admired for its unique style, blending the authentic Balkan brass band sound with rich harmonies from a variety of genres.

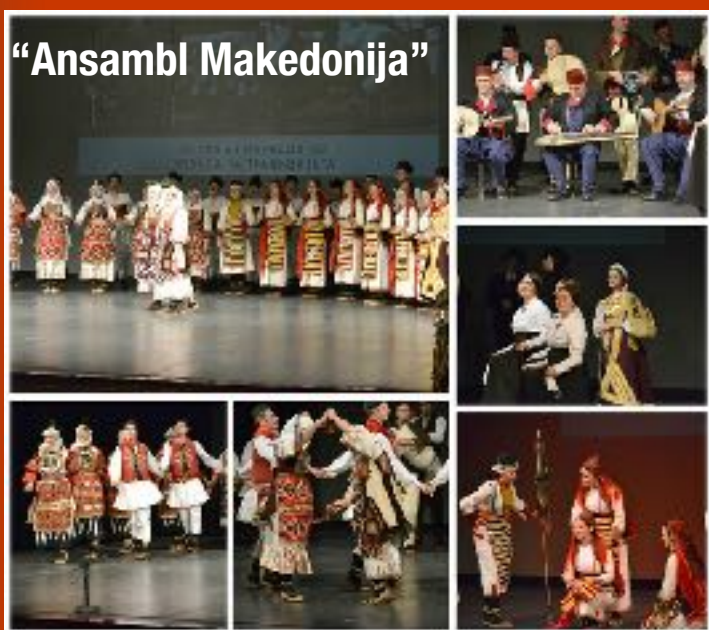
